<p><b>1. Hunting and Shooting Recruitment and Retention</b>  Does the existing facility currently host Hunter Education classes, school teams or clubs [the season counts as 1 event], Learn to Hunt events, or other recruitment and retention programs for hunting and the shooting sports? <p><b>Proposed New Ranges</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The applicant completes the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Adequately explains why a new range is needed at the proposed location. 5 – 10</li> <li>○ Explains how the proposed shooting activities (pistol/rifle/shotgun patterning; archery; wing shooting activities such as trap, skeet, 5-stand, sporting clays) were chosen. 5 – 10</li> <li>○ The application package <b>comprehensively</b> explains how they will ensure safety, mitigate environmental impacts, and minimize noise. Includes documentation that applicant has discussed range plans with local government and zoning. 5 – 10</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
<p><b>Grant History</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Applicant has never received a Shooting Range Grant or has not received a Shooting Range Grant within the last 10 years. 10 possible</li> <li>• The Applicant has received one or more Shooting Range Grants within the last 10 years and has successfully completed and closed all grant projects. 10</li> <li>• The Applicant has a current shooting range grant project. 5</li> <li>• The Applicant has a current shooting range grant project. 0</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Lead Management</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The shooting range has conducted lead reclamation activities within the last 10 years, or the proposed range has provided a lead reclamation plan. 10 possible</li> <li>• The range is an archery range that does not need to conduct lead reclamation activities. 10</li> <li>• The range has not completed lead reclamation activities in the last 10 years, or the proposed new range did not provide a lead reclamation plan. 0</li> </ul>
