Celebrating the private forestry community's connection with over 20K Wisconsin landowners!

In 2018, the Chief State Forester of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) adopted the Wisconsin Private Forestry Advisory Committee's (WPFAC) recommendations that encouraged the professional forestry community of partners to collaborate toward a 5-year goal of connecting with 20,000 new non-industrial private forest (NIPF) landowners. That formative moment when a landowner walks their property with a forester is our measure of success—as visits offer confidence and credibility for the landowner's actions! Since the average ownership is 50 acres, we are well on our way toward bringing the next million acres into sustainable forestry.

DNR Foresters and Cooperating Foresters conducted walk-throughs to build supportive relationships with landowners and bring our **5-year total to 21,172** property visits!
