

Algae are common in lakes and rivers.

But at high concentrations a type called "blue-green" algae can make people and animals sick.

What to look for:

- Does the water look "pea soupy"?
- Does it smell swampy?

Blue-green algae can:

- irritate skin, eyes and nasal passages and make you sick.
- poison your pets or livestock
 animals have died from it.

If you or your pets have come in contact with blue-green algae, wash thoroughly.

Think you or animals

are sick from it?

Call a doctor or

veterinarian immediately.



When in doubt, best keep out.
