

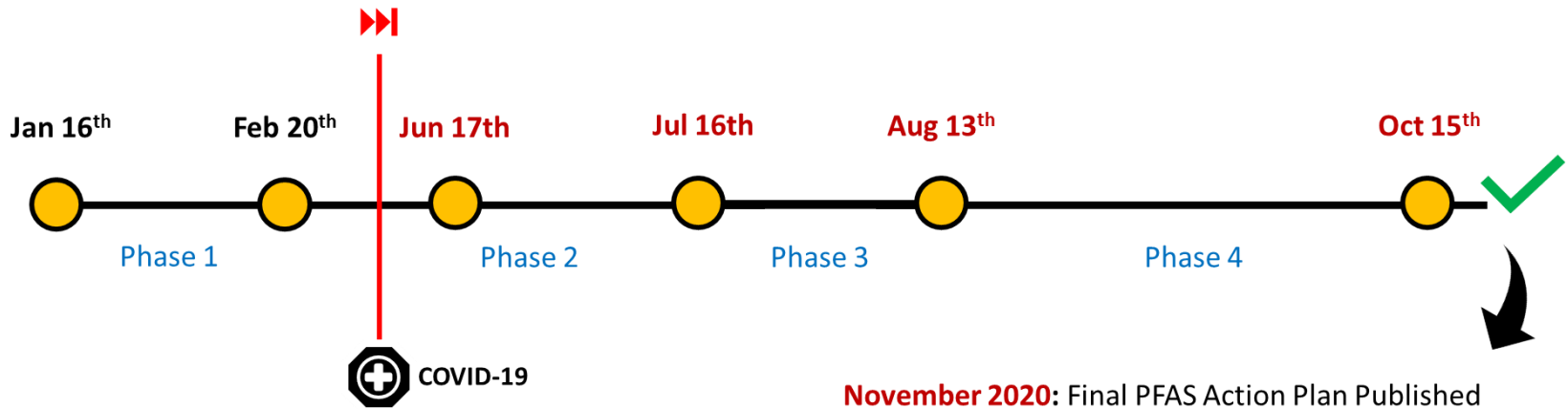

  - Cooperative agreements with states (DOD)

- Some differences on the “how” of implementation
- Groups’ perspectives to be included in report in several ways

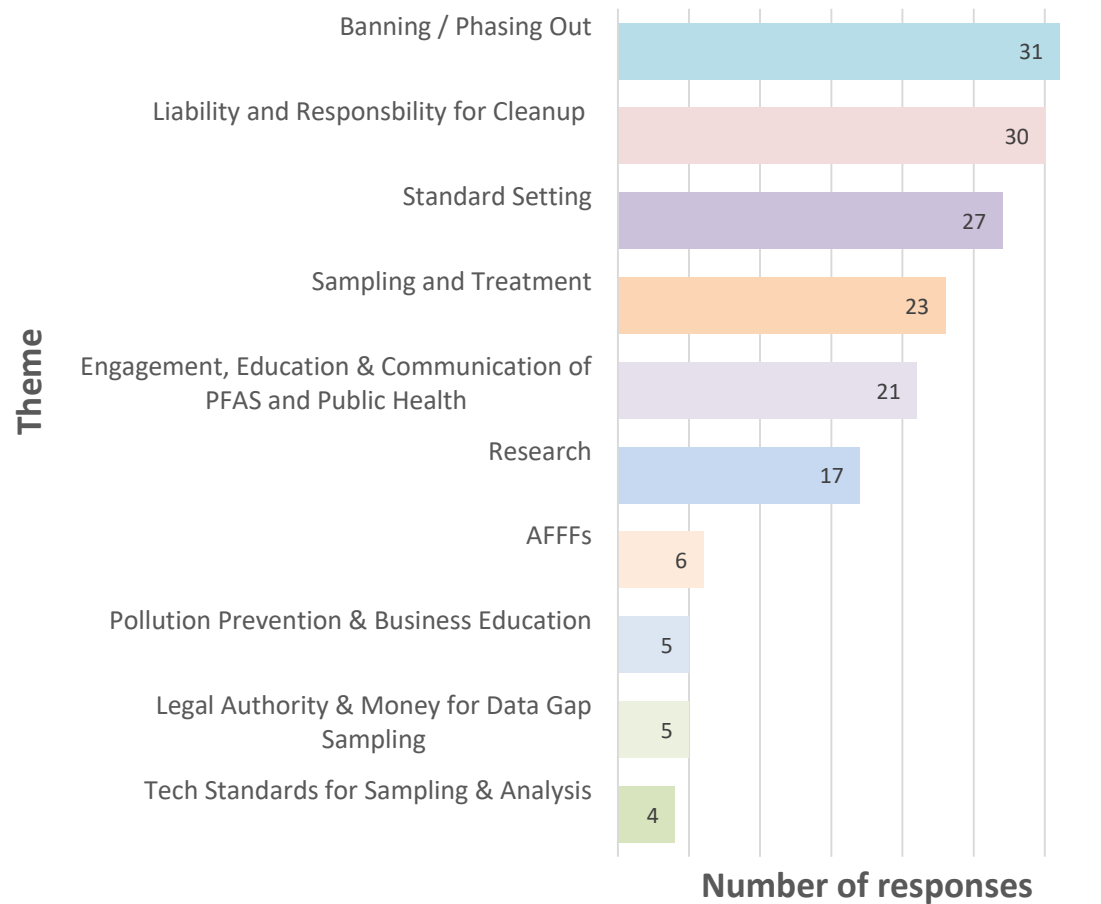
