### **Notice of Preliminary Hearing on Statement of Scope**

The Department of Natural Resources announces that it will hold a preliminary public hearing on Statement of Scope SS 008-25 which affects ch. NR 140, related to numeric standards to minimize the concentration of polluting substances for certain Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) in groundwater based on the 2025 DHS recommendations.

#### **Rule Information**

The proposed rule will add public health groundwater standards for six PFAS, using Department of Health Services' (DHS) January 2025 recommendations. DHS's recommendations rely on new federal drinking water standards issued on April 10, 2024, that are based on newly available science and protection of public health. The six PFAS include the contaminant compounds perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA), perfluorooctane sulfonic acid (PFOS), perfluorohexane sulfonic acid (PFHxS), perfluorononanoic acid (PFNA), perfluorobutane sulfonic acid (PFBS), and hexafluoropropylene oxide dimer acid (HFPO-DA, commonly known as GenX Chemicals). Setting standards will allow for consistent use in state regulatory programs to minimize the concentration of these polluting substances in the groundwater resources of the state.

The objective of the proposed rule is to protect public health, given that groundwater is the primary source of drinking water throughout the state. PFAS breaks down very slowly and can accumulate in people. PFAS may cause reproductive effects such as decreased fertility and pregnancy-induced hypertension, developmental effects or delays in children including birth defects and low birth weight, increased risk of some cancers including prostate, kidney, and testicular cancers, decreased antibody response to vaccines, and increased cholesterol.
