



# Good Neighbor Authority Sale Area Map Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources

Eagle River-Florence Ranger District Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest T40N R11E, Section 22, 23, 26 - Vilas County, WI

Unit #1 - Thinning – Stand 2001-03,04,05,08,44 & 2002-02 (50 acres): Harvest all trees marked with blue paint.

Unit #2 - Northern Hardwood Selection – Stand 2002-12 & 29 (220 acres): Harvest all trees marked with blue paint. Within purple-painted gaps, harvest all trees greater than 1-inch diameter including purple-painted trees. In areas with hemlock regeneration, take special care to avoid unnecessary damage and cut balsam fir as needed for felling and skidding.

Unit #3 - Hemlock Hardwood - Stand 2002-10 (5 acres): Harvest all trees marked with blue paint. Harvest during snow-free conditions if possible.

**Unit #4 - Pine Thinning/Overstory Removal** – Stand 2002-06 & 08 (10 acres): Within the two-dot purple lined areas, harvest all merchantable trees. In the remainder of the stand, harvest all trees marked with blue paint.

**Unit #5 –Shelterwood** – Stand 2002-01 (42 acres): Within the Aesthetic Reserve Area along Military Road and Highway 70, harvest all trees marked with blue paint. In the remainder of the stand, harvest all trees greater than 1-inch diameter except red oak and white pine saplings and trees marked with orange paint.

Unit #6 – Irregular Shelterwood – Stand 2001-01 (12 acres): Within the Aesthetic Reserve Area along Military Road and Highway 70, harvest all trees marked with blue paint. In the remainder of the stand, harvest all trees marked with blue paint and all sub-merchantable trees except white pine and red oak.

Unit #7 - Mechanical Row Thinning - 2001-06 (32 acres): Harvest every third row, marked with blue paint as needed to define rows.

- Stands 2002-01,12,29: Harvesting may only occur October 1st through April 15th due to oak wilt restrictions.
- · All other stands: Harvesting may occur during dry, firm, or frozen ground at the discretion of the timber sale administrator.
- All pine products cut between May 1st and September 1st must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to May 1st of each year.

All volume estimates were obtained using the 'sticks plus trees' volume estimating system. NHAL State Forest base stumpage rates used for all product values.

- 1. Mixed hardwood pulp contains 49% red maple, 34% hard maple, 8% red oak, 5% mixed hardwoods, 4% paper birch, and 1% yellow birch.
- 2. Comingled red pine contains 57% pulp and 43% logs.
- 3. Comingled white pine contains 66% pulp and 34% logs (including 86% white pine, 13% jack pine and 1% hemlock).
- 4. Mixed hardwood log volume includes 67% red maple and 33% sugar maple.

#### **General Harvest Information and Special Conditions:**

- No sale work may begin without prior notification and an on-site meeting with the sale administrator.
- Prior notification must be given to the sale administrator before harvesting 2002-06 & 08.
- Billing will use mill scale ticket system. (Logs sold will be mill scaled.)
- No bid bond required. A performance bond of 15% of the total sale bid value will be required.
- The contract period is 3 YEARS, ending June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2026.
- Cutting areas are bounded by orange and red paint lines or established roads. See sale map for details.
- Harvesting in cutting areas (stands) must be completed prior to moving to another cutting area.
- Cutting must be concurrent for all species including required 1-5" diameter stems in the purple

- gap areas.
- Reasonable care shall be taken to avoid unnecessary damage to residual trees and regeneration.
- Utilization to at least a 4-inch top.
- The harvesting of any portion of a tree that lies outside the physical ownership of the Forest Service will not be allowed. Trees lying across the property line must be bucked at the ownership line and all portions of the tree that reside on the private side of the line must be left in place. Conversely, the remaining portion of the tree that lies within the physical ownership of the Forest Service may be harvested and utilized.
- Equipment must be cleaned and inspected before entering and leaving sale area to prevent the introduction/spread of invasive species.
- All slash shall be lopped and scattered to lie within two feet of the ground for 100 feet from Highway 70, Cranberry Creek Road (2437) and Forest Lane (3731).
- Along Military Road (2178), all slash shall be lopped and scattered to lie within one foot of the ground within the Aesthetic Area (designated on the map) and shall be lopped and scattered to lie within two feet for 100 feet along the remainder of Military Road (2178).
- All other slash shall be pulled 10 feet from the edge of all roads, trails, private land, wetlands and riparian areas, and shall be lopped and scattered to lie within 4 feet of the ground.
- In all harvest areas, do not cut standing snags unless they pose a safety risk.
- See cutting prescriptions and seasonal restrictions listed on the map.

#### **Road and Skid Trails:**

- Purchaser is required to post signs on public trails and roads entering active harvest areas alerting recreationalists of harvest activities.
- Purchaser is responsible to obtain written permission from local town to deck wood on town roads. No decking of wood is permitted on Military Road. No decking of wood is permitted on Forest Lane without prior permission from the Town and the DNR timber sale administrator.
- Chequamegon-Nicolet Forest Plan requires that all native surfaced approaches to paved or graveled roads have 100 ft. of gravel, 6 in. deep, 12 ft. wide laid down when used during nonfrozen conditions.
- All landings and skid trails will be blocked to vehicular access after use.
- Any new temporary roads or turn-arounds will need approval by the timber sale administrator.
- The location and clearing widths of all Temporary Roads shall be agreed to in writing before
  construction is started. "Temporary Roads" are roads other than Specified Roads that are
  constructed by Purchaser for the purpose of harvesting included timber.
- Temporary Roads shall have the road base constructed to a width of 12 feet or narrower, and
  with vegetative clearing of tree and brush not to exceed a width of 25 feet. Exceptions to the 12foot maximum width of the road base may be granted by the sale administrator. Exceptions would
  typically be granted for sections of temporary roads where tight turns, curves, and terrain create a
  need so that trucks and equipment can be operated safely.
- The following roads must be decommissioned if they are used for trucking: 614310, 6143103, 6143105, 6143108, 614311, 6143114, 614313, 61432, 61433, 61434, 61435, 61436, 61437, 61438, 61439. In order to decommission roads as required, Purchaser shall, at locations designated by the Sale Administrator, construct two mounds at approximately 75-foot intervals with scattered slash and logging debris between the mounds. Mounds shall be at least four feet in height and shall be made with dirt mixed with rocks, stumps, logs, root-wads, or slash and shall be constructed without creating a defined trench.
- All road maintenance and rehabilitation post-harvest is the purchaser's responsibility. Please refer to the sample contract for this sale for specific road maintenance specifications. Contact DNR Forester Kelsey Dencker at the Crandon Ranger Station (715) 216-0286 for more information.

- <u>T-8110</u>: Maintenance Blading/Grading is keeping an aggregate surfaced roadbed in a condition to facilitate traffic and provide proper drainage. It includes maintaining the crown, inslope or outslope of the traveled way, turnouts, and shoulder; repairing berms; blending approach road intersections; and cleaning drainage dips and lead-off ditches.
- <u>T-8130:</u> Spot Surface Course Placement/Replenishment includes subgrade preparation, furnishing, hauling, spreading and shaping materials in accordance with the requirements.
- <u>T-8420</u>: This work includes removal of brush, trees and other vegetative growth from within the clearing limits. This may include brush mowing of shoulders to prevent larger growth which would inhibit travel in the future.
