

- In all stands, harvest all trees marked with blue paint.
- Canopy gaps delineated with purple chevrons. In these canopy gaps all stems 1" DBH and larger and purple marked trees should be cut, except for Hemlock, Red Oak, White Pine, or American Elm.
- All Ironwood greater than 1" is designated to be harvested.
- Reserve all snags and live den trees unless they pose a safety concern.
- Care shall be taken to protect all advanced regeneration of present tree species.
- Do not cut any Hemlock, Red Oak, White Pine, or American Elm unless they interfere with logging operations.

Boundary Designation Methods:

- Orange Paint: Harvest boundaries.
- Red Paint: Private property boundaries.
- •Blue Paint: Individual trees marked for removal.
- •Purple Paint: 60' canopy gaps.
- •Designated: All merchantable ironwood will be designated for harvest.

General Sale Conditions:

- Do not harvest trees or operate equipment across Orange Paint lines.
- Equipment must be cleaned before entering or leaving sale are a to prevent the introduction/spread of invasive plant species.

Seasonal Restrictions:

• Endangered, threatened, and sensitive species screening was also completed for the sale area. The immediate area around Torpee Creek and Stand 2 shall have no harvest activity <u>between April 1 and October 1.</u> This area is delineated with <u>double sided orange chevrons</u>.

Plots were taken on a 4.5 chain grid and plot data includes measuring individual tree diameter and # of 8' sticks per tree to calculate volumes. Plots taken in 2019.

Sale Conditions:

- No bid bond required. A performance bond of 15% of the total sale bid value required.
- The cutting area is approximately 375 acres.
- The contract period is 3 years. (End Date: December 31, 2027).
- The entire sale shall have no harvesting between April 1 and July 1. Portions of the sale also have a restriction between April 1 and October 1. See sale map for details.
- Sale bounded by Orange paint. See sale maps for specifics.
- Canopy gaps delineated with Purple chevrons.
- Do not harvest trees, drop slash, or operate equipment across **Orange** paint line.
- No cutting or skidding in areas outlined with 2 or 3 Orange Dots.
- Damage to any residual trees will not be tolerated.
- Leave all standing snag and den trees that do not pose a safety hazard.
- Utilization will be to a 4" top.
- All slash shall be lopped and scattered within 2' of the ground.

¹ Mixed Hardwood pulp contains 63% sugar maple, 14% ash, and 23% birch, red maple, aspen, black cherry, hickory, ironwood, and beech.

²Mixed conifer product class contains 60% hemlock and 40% spruce and balsam fir.

- Equipment must be cleaned and inspected before entering and leaving the sale area to prevent the spread of invasives.
- Billing for pulp and any bolt products will use a mill scale ticket system. Logs may be mill scaled or field scaled, at the discretion of the timber sale administrator.
- The harvesting of any portion of a tree that lies outside the physical ownership of the Forest Service will not be allowed. Trees lying across the property line must be bucked at the ownership line and all portions of the tree that reside on the private side of the line must be left in place.
- Conversely, the remaining portion of the tree that lies within the physical ownership of the Forest Service may be harvested and utilized.

Cutting Prescription:

Single Tree Selection Area: Stands 5184-2,16,17 (375 Acres)

- In all stands, harvest all trees marked with blue paint. Do not harvest trees with red paint,
- Canopy gaps delineated with purple chevrons. In these canopy gaps all stems 1" DBH and larger and purple marked trees should be cut, except for Hemlock, Red Oak, White Pine, or American Elm.
- All Ironwood greater than 1" is designated to be harvested.
- Reserve all snags and live den trees unless they pose a safety concern.
- Care shall be taken to protect all advanced regeneration of present tree species.
- <u>Do not cut any Hemlock, Red Oak, White Pine, or American Elm</u> unless they interfere with logging operations.

Special Conditions:

- NO SALE MAY BEGIN WITHOUT PRIOR NOTIFICATION AND AN ON-SITE MEETING WITH A WISCONSIN DNR SALE ADMINISTRATOR.
- Purchaser required to post signs on USFS roads alerting recreationalists of logging activities.
- Purchased is responsible for obtaining written permission from local town to deck wood on town roads
- All landings and skid trails will be blocked to vehicular access after use.
- All new temporary roads or turn arounds will need approval by the timber sale administrator.
- Temporary roads shall have the road base constructed to be width of 12 feet or less, and with
 vegetative clearing not to exceed a width of 25 feet. Exceptions to the 12-foot maximum width of
 the road base may be granted by the administrator. Exceptions would typically be granted for
 sections of temporary roads where tight turns, curves, and terrain create a need so that trucks
 and equipment can be operated safely.
- All pine products cut between May 1 and September 1 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to May 1 of each year.
- Chequamegon-Nicolet Forest Plan requires that all native surfaced approaches to paved or graveled roads have 100 ft. of gravel, 6 in. deep, 12 ft. wide put down when used during nonfrozen conditions.
- Hauling is prohibited on the ATV/Snowmobile Trails on, weekends starting noon on Friday, through midnight Sunday, Federal Holidays, and between Christmas Day and New Year's Day. At all times during the snowmobile season, keep at least 4" of packed snow on the trail. Keep trail clearing (10' from the edge of the trail) cleared of debris resulting from purchaser's operations as work progresses. Do not deck wood on inside curves, where it could obscure oncoming traffic.
- Within a 10' wide strip from the edge of the opening along FR 2060 all slash resulting from Purchaser's operations shall be removed.
- The location and clearing widths of all Temporary Roads shall be agreed to in writing before
 construction is started. "Temporary Roads" are roads other than Specified Roads that are
 constructed by Purchaser for the purpose of harvesting included timber.
- When two or more commercial users are simultaneously using the same road, the commercial users will develop maintenance responsibilities and arrangements for accomplishing the work.

Seller must agree to this plan. If the commercial users cannot agree on maintenance responsibilities, seller shall resolve the differences.

- All road maintenance and rehabilitation post-harvest is the purchaser's responsibility.
- The following roads will be decommissioned after use and closed with a berm. Berms must be
 constructed at designated locations by DNR Sale Administrator and shall be created using the
 following design features: Berms must be at least four feet in height and must be made with dirt
 mixed with rocks, stumps, logs, root-wads, or slash and shall be created without creating a
 defined trench.

<u>T-8110</u>: Maintenance Blading/Grading is keeping an aggregate surfaced Roadbed in a condition to facilitate traffic and provide proper drainage. It includes maintaining the Crown, Inslope or Outslope of

the Traveled Way, Turnouts, and Shoulder; repairing Berms; blending approach road intersections; and cleaning Drainage Dips and Lead-off Ditches.

<u>T-8420</u>: This work includes removal of brush, trees and other vegetative growth from within the clearing limits. This may include brush mowing of shoulders to prevent larger growth which would inhibit travel in the future.

<u>T-8130</u>: This work includes subgrade preparation, furnishing, hauling, spreading, and shaping materials in accordance with USFS requirements. Only commercial sources of aggregate will be accepted, except surfacing material may also be purchased from the government, where available, by filling out a form, 2600, paying the required fees, and obtaining a permit.
