

Other species not mentioned will be charged at the Mixed Hardwood or Conifer price, accordingly.

- 1) Bids must meet or exceed the total minimum acceptable bid of \$34,885.00.
- 2) Each species/product must be bid on (per ton or MBF).
- 3) A bid will be rejected if any individual species/product bid is \$0.
- 4) Cordwood weight conversion factors are as follows:

Mixed Hardwood = 2.400 Aspen = 2.250 Mixed Conifer = 2.125

Paint Color Scheme:

Orange: Sale/harvest boundary and reserve/leave trees. Do not cut any orange marked trees.

Seasonal Restrictions:

- Harvesting operations on 67 acres are limited to <u>frozen ground conditions only.</u>
 - This includes all of the Aspen Coppice Area and the Birch Shelterwood Area adjacent to the Ice Age Trail. The remaining Birch Shelterwood Area can be harvested any time of year as long as the ground is not saturated (see Sale Area Map for restricted areas).
- Within areas adjacent to the Ice Age National Scenic Trail, no logging activity may occur on weekends from noon Friday to 6 a.m. Monday.

Harvest Requirements:

- Contract ending date will be **June 30, 2027** (allowing approximately 3 years to complete).
- Harvest boundaries include orange paint line, wetland edge, and aspen saplings.
- No machine operation allowed outside of orange boundary paint line, or in adjacent wetland areas.
- No bond is required with bid on this timber sale. A performance bond of 15% of the total bid value will be required within 6 weeks of announcement of successful bidder.
- Sale will be mill scale using a 30-day billing period.

¹Mixed Hardwood Pulp includes 45% red maple, 45% white birch, 5% ash, and 5% hard maple (with small amounts of basswood, cherry, and other species).

²Mixed Conifer includes 80% balsam fir and 20% white spruce.

³Mixed Hardwood Saw includes 5 MBF ash, 3 MBF hard maple, and 2 MBF basswood.

• Equipment must be cleaned and inspected by DNR staff before entering and leaving the sale area to prevent the introduction/spread of invasive species.

Slash Requirements:

- A 10-foot slash removal zone shall be applied to both sides of the Ice Age National Scenic Trail.
- Slash height within 150 feet of the Ice Age Trail shall be less than 24" in height.
- Do not pile slash within riparian or other wetland areas.

Road/Trail Requirements:

- The Ice Age Trail must be kept clear from logging debris at all times. Ground skidding and hauling on the trail is prohibited except at crossings designated by the timber sale administrator. Log landings must be placed off the trail far enough so that logs and logging vehicles will not be within the cleared right of way. Caution "Logging Ahead" signs must be placed along trail on either side of logging activity during all aspects of operations.
- DOT approved signage is required to be placed on Mondeaux Avenue (FR 102) near the White Birch Trailhead during harvest and hauling operations for safety reasons.
- Decking of wood at the White Birch Trailhead parking area is prohibited. Decking along woods roads is preferred for safety reasons and local access concerns.

Additional Requirements:

- NO SALE MAY BEGIN WITHOUT PRIOR NOTIFICATION AND AN ON-SITE MEETING WITH A WISCONSIN DNR SALE ADMINISTRATOR.
- Keep all logging debris and machine operations within sale boundaries.
- Leave all standing snag and cull/den trees that do not pose a safety hazard. If needed to remove as a safety precaution, cut and leave lay on the ground.
- New temporary roads, stubs, or turn-arounds will need approval by the timber sale administrator and may require berms/slash.
- Temporary Roads shall have the road base constructed to a width of 12 feet or narrower, and with vegetative clearing of trees and brush not to exceed a width of 25 feet. Exceptions to the 12-foot maximum width of the road base may be granted by the sale administrator for operational reasons.
- If roads that are marked with **Proposed Berm** symbol are utilized (W152220 and Temp 3059022), they must be closed with a logging debris berm. Do not dig a depression that will collect and hold water when constructing berms.
 - o **Proposed Berm** shall be constructed using logging debris which includes any combination of dirt mixed with rocks, stumps, logs, root-wads, and/or slash.
 - o **Proposed Berm** shall be constructed without creating a defined trench.
 - o **Proposed Berm** shall be at least 4-5 feet in height from ground level.
- All road maintenance and post-harvest rehabilitation will be the purchaser's responsibility. A sample contract including road maintenance specifications can be obtained upon request.
