BIDDING REQUIREMENTS

1. Bidding Procedure for Timber Sales
 - a. Bids will be made by species for each tract.
 - b. Estimated volumes and utilization specifications are listed on individual sale prospectus maps. Bid according to volumes listed on individual sale prospectus and/or maps.
 - c. The **high bidder** will be determined by the **greatest total bid** for each tract.
 - d. Bids will be opened in random order.
 - e. **Bidders in attendance (virtual)** can remove their bid from consideration before each individual tract is opened. Bidders must identify themselves by clearly stating their name, address, and telephone number PRIOR to a bid being opened to withdraw their bid from consideration.

2. Bids may be made on one or more tracts.
3. Submit each bid in an individual sealed envelope marked "Bid for Timber Stumpage" with the timber sale name, and tract number on the outside. Wisconsin DNR Timber Sale Bid Forms must be used to make bids on DNR timber sales and is included with the individual sale prospectus
4. A per unit bid must be made on every item on a tract. No "zero" bids for any species or products will be accepted.
5. Winning bidders will be notified within 24 hours of bid opening and must sign the timber sale contract and submit an acceptable performance bond within 6 weeks of the bid opening. If the winning bidder fails to execute the contract and submit an acceptable performance bond, the bidder shall be required to forfeit to the department an amount equal to 10% of the total bid amount. Failure to forfeit the 10% penalty will result in the bidder being considered ineligible to bid on any state or GNA timber sales for a two-year period.
6. A Performance Bond or Letter of Credit is required before awarding of contract. The bond shall be fifteen percent (15%) of the total bid value or a minimum of \$1000.00, whichever is greater. The bond will be held intact by the Department of Natural Resources until the satisfactory completion of the timber sale contract. Performance bonds in a form of other than cash for these sales must expire no earlier than **1-year past contract expiration date.**
7. The Department of Natural Resources reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

SALES TAX CERTIFICATION

1. A Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate must be provided at the signing of the contract. This certificate is required to cover a contractor or individual reselling stumpage harvested for firewood/fuelwood and mills and manufacturing facilities. UTILIZATION

1. All trees designated for cutting will be utilized to a 4" top unless stated otherwise in the prospectus.
2. See individual timber sales for utilization specifications

SCALING AND PAYMENT

1. If eligible for deferred payment option, payment for timber removed from site must be made within 30 days after invoice.
2. If not eligible for deferred payment option, no wood will be hauled from the sale area until advanced payment is made.
3. If sold as a lump sum sale, payment in full must be made on entire sale, or by the cutting block, or by some other means as mutually agreed upon by Department of Natural Resources and contractor.
4. The mill scale ticket system will be used as the preferred method of sale administration. Other scaling systems may be used at the discretion of the Department of Natural Resources.
5. If a woods scale system is used, all cordwood or logs will be piled for scaling. Piles will be level and square with at least 10 cords per pile. At least 10 cords will be piled before a scale is requested. Scaling requests must be made at least one day in advance.
6. No refunds of stumpage payments will be made for un-removed wood, and wood left on the sale area at contract expiration shall revert to the seller.
7. Scribner Decimal C Log Rule shall be used for scaling logs. Conversion from MBF to cords or cords to MBF shall be 2.44 cords per MBF for softwoods and 2.2 cords per MBF for hardwoods.

8. Weight scale conversions will be at rates as specified in the Department of Natural Resources timber sale handbook listed below, unless the individual timber sale has specific mixed species pro-rates/conversions.

CONTRACT PERIOD

1. All contracts offered during this bid opening will expire either **June 30th, 2025 or June 30th, 2026**, unless noted on individual timber sale map.

CONTRACT EXTENSIONS

Contract extensions will not be granted without justifiable reason. Justification will be determined by the Department of Natural Resources. Contract expiration dates are given on the individual timber sale. Contract extensions are not guaranteed. All extensions, if granted, will be for 1 year. Extension requests will be considered with the following conditions:

One and Two-year contracts

- 1st extension – 5% increase in stumpage rate
- 2nd extension – an additional 10% increase in stumpage rate

Three and Four-year Contracts

- 1st extension – 15% increase in stumpage rate (only 1 extension granted)

OTHER CONDITIONS

Contract may contain other provisions. Contracts may not be assigned. A sample copy of the contract is available upon request.

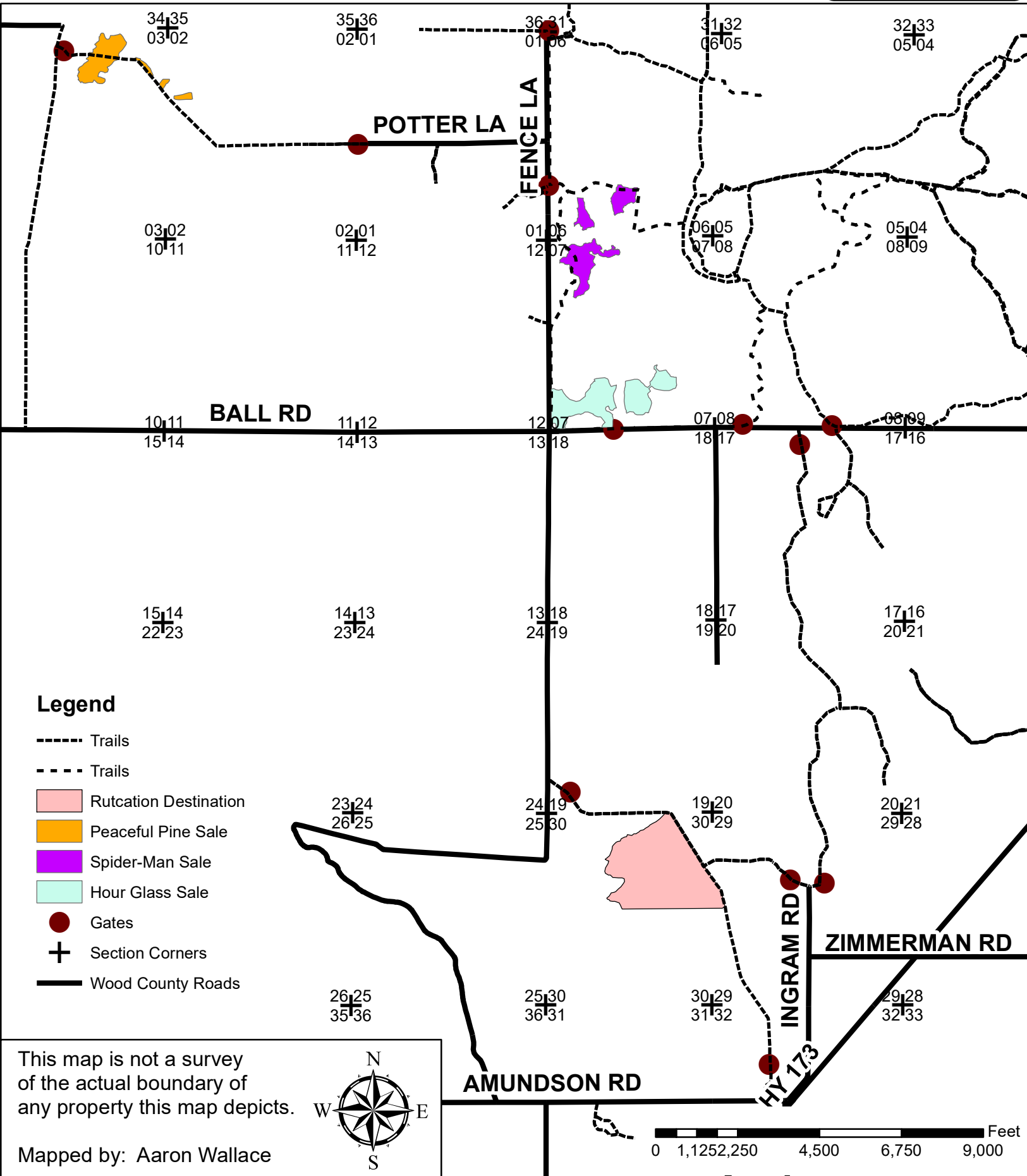

Cutting Specifications

Unit 1- (33 Acres) Within the red painted boundary cut all black/pin/red oak, aspen, red maple, black cherry, and white birch greater than 1-inch DBH. Do NOT cut any red pine, white oak, green marked, or red marked trees. All standing dead trees within falling distance of any access road or trail shall be cut.

Operational Considerations-

- The contractor must contact the appropriate Department of Natural Resource (DNR) Forester a minimum of one week prior to starting a sale contract.
- If the contract is to be worked on during multiple time periods, a mid-contract “pull-off” inspection meeting is required. Notice shall be given by the contractor a minimum of 1 week prior to moving equipment off-site. During the pull-off inspection, provisions needing attention will be documented. At that time the contractor and forester will decide whether to remedy them before moving equipment off the site; or remedy them when moving back onto the site. If the latter is chosen, the documented items shall be addressed before harvesting can continue.
- Landing and skid trail locations must be approved by the DNR Forester or Property Manager prior to starting work on the sale. All existing trails, roads, and clearings used for logging operations must be restored to pre-sale conditions by the purchaser.
- Rutting shall be monitored and if soil disturbances become excessive, harvesting operations may be suspended until the affected areas are repaired properly.
- Any firewood sold to a 3rd party must either be stick-scaled by DNR prior to leaving the timber sale, or it must be sold via a triplicate ticket system. If the ticket system is used,

then the logger, 3rd party firewood purchaser, and DNR must each receive a copy of each ticket.

- No woodpiles may be left on the landing for more than 30 days without advance approval of the Seller.
 - Slash shall be lopped and/or scattered evenly across sale area and lie within three (3) feet of the ground.
 - Access is a gated trail off West Fence Road.
 - Not all DNR roads and trails are maintained during the winter months and will be the responsibility of the contractor to maintain.
 - Invasive Plants
 1. Off-road logging equipment shall be free of concentrations of plant material and soil prior to entering the sale area. The Purchaser will contact the Seller 48 hours prior to delivering equipment to the sale area to arrange for on-site inspection.

2. To avoid spreading invasive plant materials, all equipment must be cleaned prior to entering and leaving the sale area.
- Follow WI BMP's for water quality at all times. Avoid wetlands as much as possible and only operate within them during very dry times with timber matting or under frozen ground conditions. Some areas of this sale will likely require frozen ground conditions due to access across wetlands.

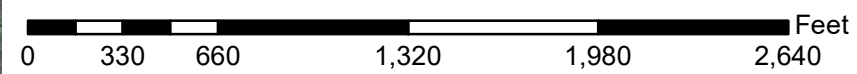

Cutting Specifications

Unit 1- (25 Acres) Within the red painted boundary cut all red and white pine marked in orange paint. Cut all black/pin/red oak, aspen, red maple, white birch, and jack pine greater than 1-inch DBH. Do NOT cut any unmarked red and white pine, white oak, green marked, or red marked trees. All standing dead trees within falling distance of any access road or trail shall be cut.

Unit 2- (2 Acres) Within the red painted boundary cut all black/pin/red oak greater than 1-inch DBH. Cut all red pine. Do NOT cut any white spruce, white oak, or any trees marked in green or red paint. All standing dead trees within falling distance of any access road or trail shall be cut.

Operational Considerations-

- The contractor must contact the appropriate Department of Natural Resource (DNR) Forester a minimum of 1 week prior to starting a sale contract.
- If the contract is to be worked on during multiple time periods, a mid-contract “pull-off” inspection meeting is required. Notice shall be given by the contractor a minimum of 1 week prior to moving equipment off-site. During the pull-off inspection, provisions needing attention will be documented. At that time the contractor and forester will decide whether to remedy them before moving equipment off the site; or remedy them when moving back onto the site. If the latter is chosen, the documented items shall be addressed before harvesting can continue.

- Landing and skid trail locations must be approved by the DNR Forester or Property Manager prior to starting work on the sale. All existing trails, roads, and clearings used for logging operations must be restored to pre-sale conditions by the purchaser.
- Rutting shall be monitored and if soil disturbances become excessive, harvesting operations may be suspended until the affected areas are repaired properly.
- Any firewood sold to a 3rd party must either be stick-scaled by DNR prior to leaving the timber sale, or it must be sold via a triplicate ticket system. If the ticket system is used, then the logger, 3rd party firewood purchaser, and DNR must each receive a copy of each ticket.
- No woodpiles may be left on the landing for more than 30 days without advance approval of the Seller.
- Slash shall be lopped and/or scattered evenly across sale area and lie within three (3) feet of the ground.
- Access is a gated trail off West Fence Road.
- Not all DNR roads and trails are maintained during the winter months and will be the responsibility of the contractor to maintain.

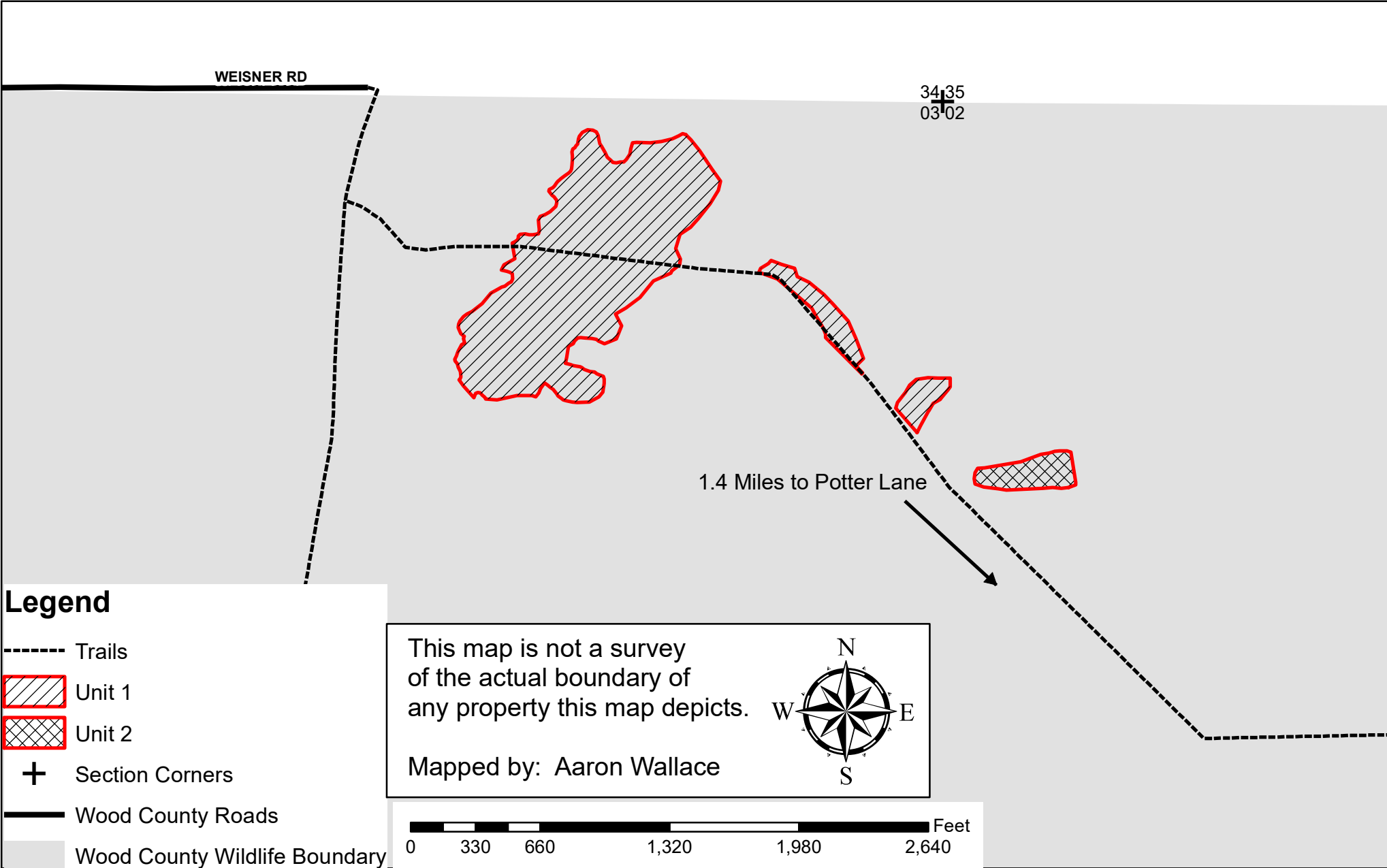

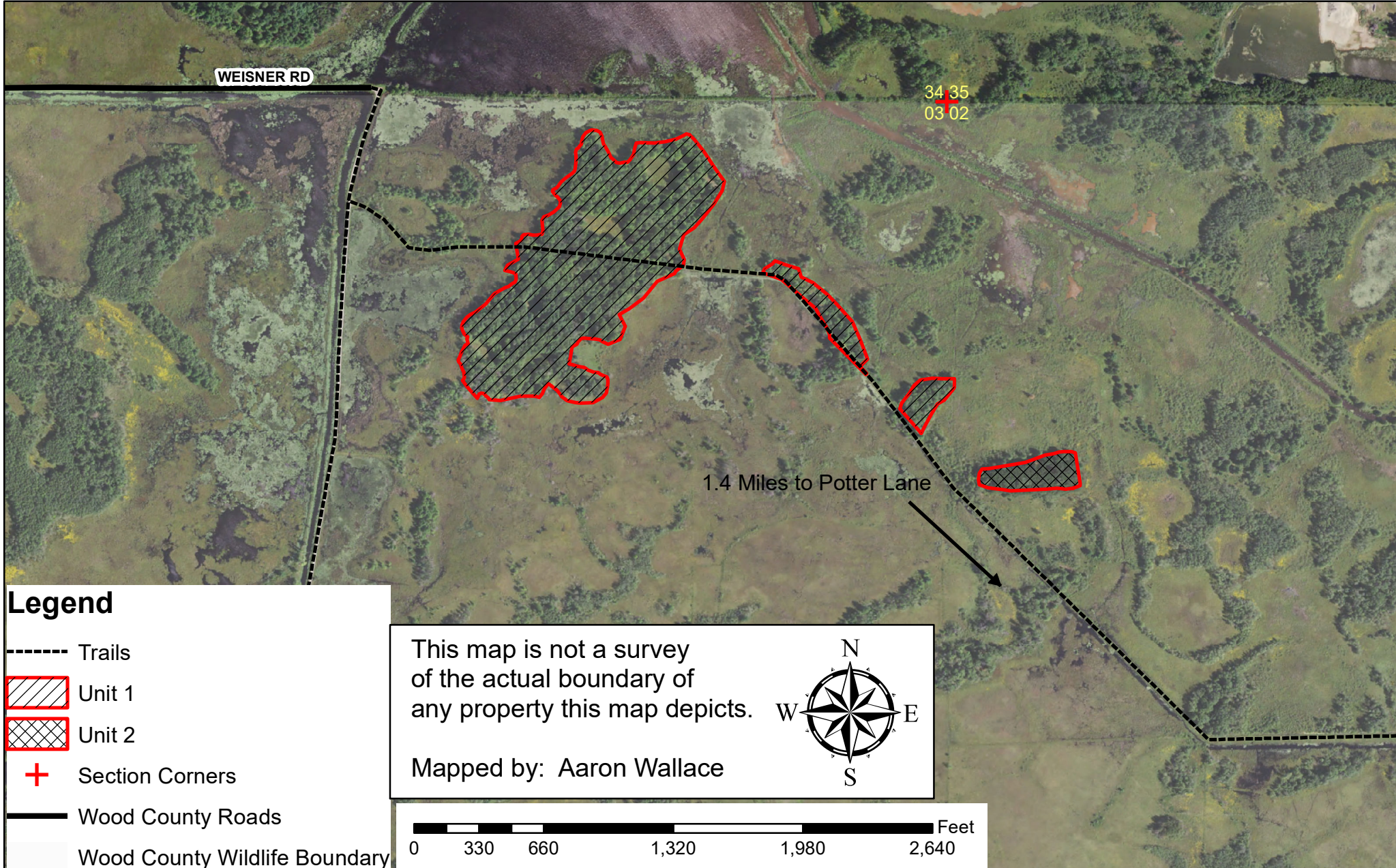
