 - a. Bids will be made by species for each tract.

SALES TAX CERTIFICATION

1. A <u>Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate</u> must be provided at the signing of the contract. This certificate is required to cover a contractor or individual reselling stumpage harvested for firewood/fuelwood and mills and manufacturing facilities. UTILIZATION

- 1. All trees designated for cutting will be utilized to a 4" top unless stated otherwise in the prospectus.
- 2. See individual timber sales for utilization specifications

SCALING AND PAYMENT

- 1. If eligible for deferred payment option, payment for timber removed from site must be made within 30 days after invoice.
- 2. If not eligible for deferred payment option, no wood will be hauled from the sale area until advanced payment is made.
- 3. If sold as a lump sum sale, payment in full must be made on entire sale, or by agreed upon cutting blocks, or by some other means as mutually agreed upon by Department of Natural Resources and contractor.

Cutting Specifications

<u>Unit 1</u>- (51 Acres) Within the sale area cut all oak, aspen, jack pine, birch, black cherry, and red maple greater than 1-inch DBH. Cut all red and white pine marked in orange paint. Do NOT cut any green marked oak, white oak, unmarked red and white pine, or any trees marked with red paint. All standing dead trees within falling distance of any access road or trail shall be cut.

Operational Considerations-

- The contractor must contact the appropriate Department of Natural Resource (DNR) Forester a minimum of 1 week prior to starting a sale contract.
- If the contract is to be worked on during multiple time periods, a mid-contract "pull-off" inspection meeting is required. Notice shall be given by the contractor a minimum of 1 week prior to moving equipment off-site. During the pull-off inspection, provisions needing attention will be documented. At that time the contractor and forester will decide whether to remedy them before moving equipment off the site; or remedy them when moving back onto the site. If the latter is chosen, the documented items shall be addressed before harvesting can continue.
- Landing and skid trail locations must be approved by the DNR Forester or Property
 Manager prior to starting work on the sale. All existing trails, roads, and clearings used for
 logging operations must be restored to pre-sale conditions by the purchaser.

- No woodpiles may be left on the landing for more than 30 days without advance approval of the Seller.
- Access is off Ball Road and South Bluff.
- Not all DNR roads and trails are maintained during the winter months and will be the responsibility of the contractor to maintain.
- Invasive Plants
 - 1. Off-road logging equipment shall be free of concentrations of plant material and soil prior to entering the sale area. The Purchaser will contact the Seller 48 hours prior to delivering equipment to the sale area to arrange for on-site inspection.



- 2. To avoid spreading invasive plant materials, all equipment must be cleaned prior to entering and leaving the sale area.
- Follow WI BMP's for water quality at all times. Avoid wetlands as much as possible and only operate within them during very dry times with timber matting or under frozen ground conditions. Some areas of this sale will likely require frozen ground conditions due to access across wetlands.
- Cutting allowed under very dry or frozen ground conditions
- No harvesting or operating equipment within 15 feet of the ditches designated on the maps.
- Between August 16th and November 30th, all pine stumps are to be treated with an EPA approved fungicide within 24 hours of cutting each tree to prevent infection by Heterobasidion Root Disease (HRD).
- Harvest period: August 16th until March 15th or until favorable winter weather conditions end.
- Lump sum sale, payment in full must be made on entire sale, or by agreed upon cutting blocks, or by some other means as mutually agreed upon by Department of Natural Resources and contractor.


