BIDDING REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Bidding Procedure for Timber Sales
 - a. Bids will be made by species for each tract.
 - b. Estimated volumes and utilization specifications are listed on individual sale prospectus maps. Bid according to volumes listed on individual sale prospectus and/or maps.
 - c. The **high bidder** will be determined by the **greatest total bid** for each tract.
 - d. Bids will be opened in random order.
 - e. Bidders in attendance (virtual) can remove their bid from consideration before each individual tract is opened. Bidders must identify themselves by clearly stating their name, address, and telephone number PRIOR to a bid being opened to withdraw their bid from consideration.
- 2. Bids may be made on one or more tracts.



- 3. <u>Submit each bid in an **individual sealed envelope** marked "Bid for Timber Stumpage" with the timber sale name, and tract number on the outside. Wisconsin DNR Timber Sale Bid Forms must be used to make bids on DNR timber sales and is included with the individual sale prospectus.</u>
- 4. A per unit bid must be made on every item on a tract. No "zero-\$0.00" bids for any species or products will be accepted and bid will be rejected.
- 5. Winning bidders will be notified within 24 hours of bid opening and must sign the timber sale contract and submit an acceptable performance bond within 6 weeks of the bid opening. If the winning bidder fails to execute the contract and submit an acceptable performance bond, the bidder shall be required to forfeit to the department an amount equal to 10% of the total bid amount. Failure to forfeit the 10% penalty will result in the bidder being considered ineligible to bid on any state or GNA timber sales for a two-year period.
- 6. A **Performance Bond or Letter of Credit** is required before awarding of contract. The bond shall be fifteen percent (15%) of the total bid value or a minimum of \$1000.00, whichever is greater. The bond will be held intact by the Department of Natural Resources until the satisfactory completion of the timber sale contract. Performance bonds in a form of other than cash for these sales must expire no earlier than 1-year past contract expiration date.
- 7. For sales requiring pesticide applications (e.g. HRD treatment). The Purchaser shall ensure and provide documentation that any person(s) who applies or handles any pesticide on Department lands is covered by a valid Pesticide Business License, Individual Commercial Applicators License, and Forestry 2.0 Certification issued by the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) prior to pesticide application.

The cost of this application can vary based on application method and harvest conditions, but should be considered when submitting bids on these timber sales.

8. The Department of Natural Resources reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

SALES TAX CERTIFICATION

1. A <u>Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate</u> must be provided at the signing of the contract. This certificate is required to cover a contractor or individual reselling stumpage harvested for firewood/fuelwood and mills and manufacturing facilities. UTILIZATION

- 1. The areas shown in red on the map will be a marked thinning, cut all trees marked with orange paint in these areas. The area shown on the map in yellow is jack pine that is to be clearcut. Cut all the jack pine in this area. In addition, cut all black walnut, aspen, box elder and mulberry through the sale area whether marked or not.
- 2. All trees designated for cutting will be utilized to a 4" minimum top diameter unless stated otherwise in the prospectus.

3. When designated for cutting, all trees containing one (1) or more one hundred inch (100") long stick to a four inch (4") minimum top diameter will be considered merchantable.

SCALING AND PAYMENT

- 1. If eligible for deferred payment option, payment for timber removed from site must be made within 30 days after invoice.
- 2. If not eligible for deferred payment option, no wood will be hauled from the sale area until advanced payment is made.
- 3. If sold as a lump sum sale, payment in full must be made on entire sale, or by the cutting block, or by some other means as mutually agreed upon by Department of Natural Resources and contractor.
- 4. The mill scale ticket system will be used as the preferred method of sale administration. Other scaling systems may be used at the discretion of the Department of Natural Resources.
- 5. No refunds of stumpage payments will be made for un-removed wood, and wood left on the sale area at contract expiration shall revert to the seller.
- 6. Scribner Decimal C Log Rule shall be used for scaling logs. Conversion from MBF to cords or cords to MBF shall be 2.44 cords per MBF for softwoods and 2.2 cords per MBF for hardwoods.
- 7. Weight scale conversions will be at rates as specified in the Department of Natural Resources timber sale handbook listed below, unless the individual timber sale has specific mixed species pro-rates/conversions.

CORDWOOD WEIGHT CONVERSION FACTORS POUNDS PER CORD

Red pine 4750 pounds per cord
White pine 4500 pounds per cord
Jack pine 4250 pounds per cord
Mixed hardwoods 5000 pounds per cord

CONTRACT PERIOD

- 1. The contract offered during this bid opening will expire **December 31, 2027**.
- 2. ** Harvest Timing: Cutting of this sale MAY NOT begin until after August 2025, as a follow-up herbicide treatment of the mulched brush is scheduled in 2025. Once the herbicide treatment is completed the cutting may begin. Work on this timber harvest can occur any time of year that the weather allows. The only exceptions include: 1) cutting in the area of the archery range at McMiller can only be done on Mondays and Tuesdays when the range is closed, and 2) the cross-country ski trails MAY NOT be damaged in any way when they are groomed for skiing.

CONTRACT EXTENSIONS

Contract extensions will not be granted without justifiable reason. Justification will be determined by the Department of Natural Resources. Contract expiration dates are given on the

individual timber sale. Contract extensions are not guaranteed. All extensions, if granted, will be for 1 year. Extension requests will be considered with the following conditions:

Three and Four-year Contracts: 1st extension -15% increase in stumpage rate (only 1 extension granted).

OTHER CONDITIONS

1. Wisconsin's Best Management Practices for Water Quality, Woody Biomass Harvesting Guidelines, and Best Management Practices for Invasive Species must be followed on all DNR timber sales. More information on these management guidelines can be found at the links found below.

- 2. The stumps of all pine trees cut on this sale are to be treated with an approved product to prevent infection by Heterobasidion root disease (HRD). This can be done by the contracting logger's crew if certified to apply pesticides, or a private contractor can be hired to treat the stumps as the harvest occurs, within 24 hours of being cut. Blu dye must be used with the spray mix to identify stumps that have been treated. If the stumps are being treated by hand, all reasonable efforts must be taken during the felling and skidding to keep slash off of the pine stumps to make it easier to find them and treat them. The logging crew must maintain communication with the pesticide applicator so that the applicator knows when logging is occurring, when to be on site to treat stumps, and where the cutting has occurred.
- 3. This sale area is crossed by public use trails that include horse/snowmobile, hiking and cross-country skiing. ** Damage to these trails will not be tolerated and any damage that may occur must be repaired immediately. The trails may be crossed by equipment as needed as long as conditions allow (frozen or dry and firm ground) but running equipment on the trails shall not occur unless permitted by the forester. **Note: The exception to this involves the cross-country ski trails that MAY NOT be damaged in any way when the trails are groomed for skiing.
- 4. All slash shall be lopped and/or scattered to lie within three feet of the ground; slash must also be removed from all public access trails. Slash shall be removed from trails so that it does not lie on or protrude into the trail zone. In addition in the archery range area, no slash is to be deposited in the archery lanes. Slash that may fall into any of these areas must be removed immediately. This is to be done concurrent with the cutting operation.

Insurance

The "Contractor" (purchaser) shall provide the Department of Natural Resources with a Certificate of Insurance counter-signed by a Wisconsin Resident Agent, indicating that Worker's Compensation Insurance coverage is provided for the duration of the contract prior to any performance under it. Contractor claiming exemption, independent status, the

contractor/purchaser will be required to submit a signed, notarized affidavit that affirms their exempt status pursuant to the criteria listed in section 102.07(7)(b), of the Wisconsin Statutes.


Contract may contain other provisions. Contracts may not be assigned. A sample copy of the contract is available upon request.



Purchaser agrees to provide documentation to Seller that the training has been attained prior to initiating sale.
