Cutting Requirements/Information

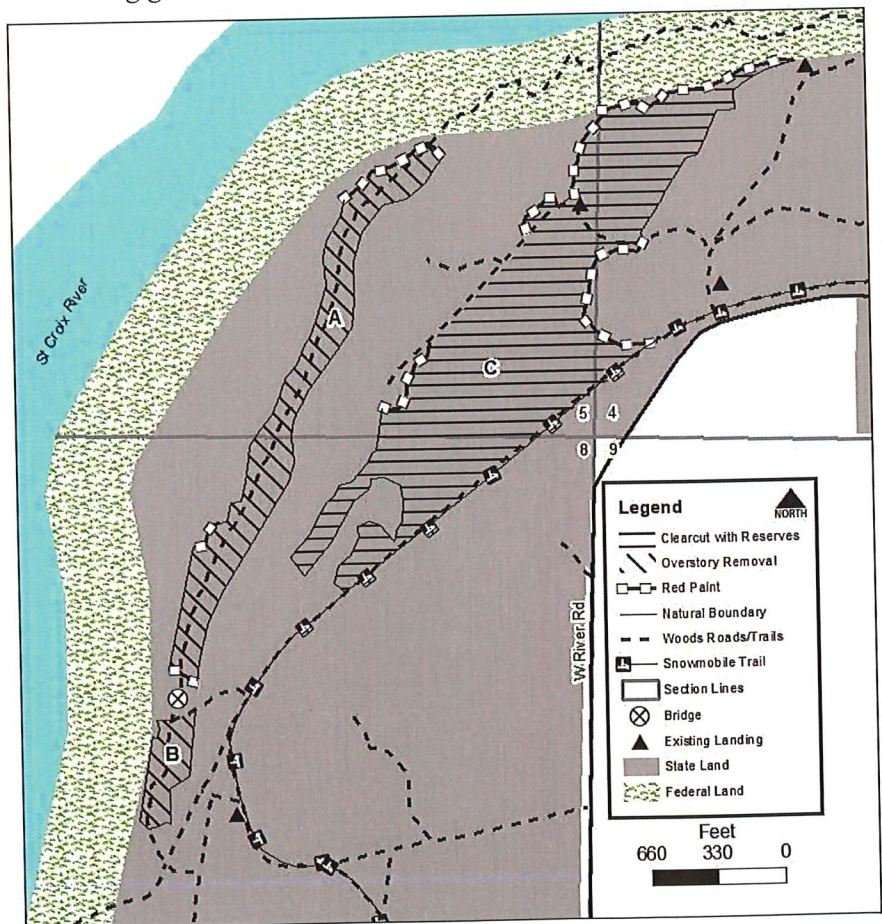


Overstory Removal - Harvest all pin oak, maple, aspen, basswood, and birch with one or more merchantable sticks. In addition, harvest all bur oak east of the trail with one or more merchantable sticks.



Clearcut with Reserves - Harvest all species with one or more merchantable sticks except pine and yellow birch.
FROZEN GROUND REQUIRED

1. Utilization: 4" top DIB. This is a mill scale sale.
2. Maximum stump height shall be 10 inches.
3. Do not harvest paint marked boundary trees.
4. Natural boundaries consist of grass or previously harvested areas with scattered white pine and/or young hardwoods.
5. Slash shall be lopped and scattered to a maximum height not to exceed three feet and kept within the sale boundaries.
6. Landings shall be approved by the Department prior to their construction.
7. An overgrown skid trail between blocks A and C is present from a prior harvest near the north end of block A.
8. All existing roads and trails shall be kept open to allow for normal use throughout the harvest. The snowmobile trail shall be kept passable and snow covered while the trail is being groomed for snowmobiling.
9. The bridge between blocks A and B is not rated for heavy equipment.
10. Harvesting shall be completed in a systematic and progressive manner.
11. Leave all snags where they are not a safety risk to the operators. Fell all snags within 50 feet of any existing trails.
12. Avoid damage to advanced regeneration or trees not designated for harvest.
13. Contractor is required to deliver all pin oak directly to a wood processing facility, minimizing the spread of oak wilt. Only pin oak that is peeled or has loose bark may be sorted and sold as firewood.
14. **Seasonal Restrictions – Block C requires frozen ground. No harvesting allowed April 1-July 31 due to oak wilt and a threatened bird.**
