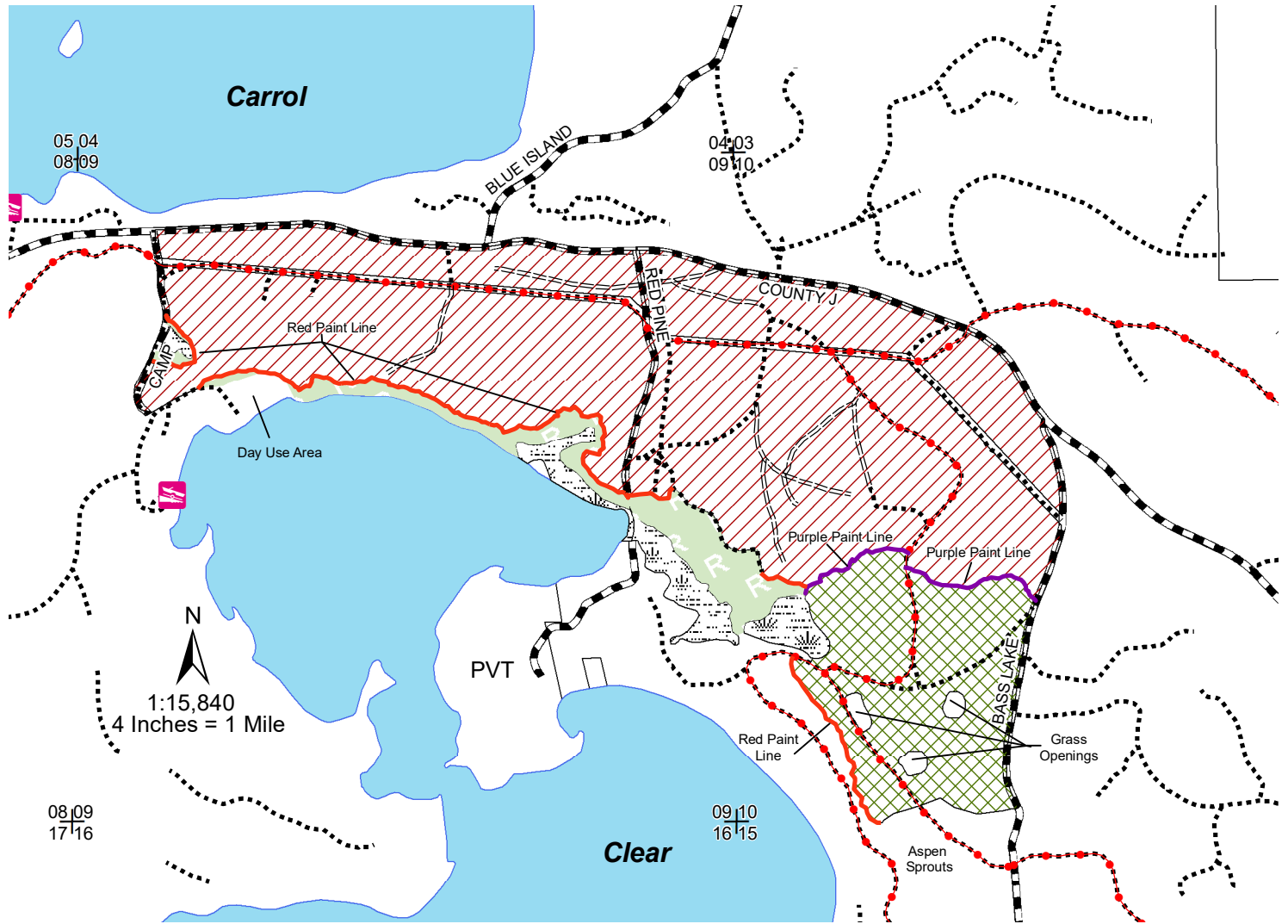


**Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources

- Hardwood Area (264 Acres) cut all merchantable aspen, white birch, ironwood, balsam fir, and orange marked trees.
- Aspen Area (64 Acres) cut all trees >1" DBH except for any pine greater than 24" DBH and green marked trees.
- Green Tree Retention Area (GTR): No harvesting allowed in this area.

***No harvesting will be allowed between April 15th and July 15th due to oak wilt restrictions.**

No bid bond is required.

15% of the total sale bid value or \$1000.00, whichever is greater, will be required for performance bond.

The cutting area is approximately 328 acres while the total sale area including GTR is 351 acres.

The contract period is 3 years.

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to the minimum top diameter chosen by the bidder will be cut and utilized.

Biomass harvesting is not permitted on this sale.

¹ Approximately 91% white pine and 9% red pine. Includes 76 MBF of potential white pine sawlogs and 7 MBF potential red pine sawlogs. (Wt. conv. 2.113 tons/cord)

² Includes 135 MBF of potential oak sawlogs.

³ Approximately 72% hard maple, 18% red maple, 5% white birch, 3% ash, 2% ironwood and <1% yellow birch. Includes 80 MBF of potential hard maple sawlogs, 34 MBF potential red maple sawlogs, 10 MBF potential ash sawlogs, and 2 MBF potential white birch sawlogs. (Wt. conv. 2.475 tons/cord)

Note: Total sale volume equates to 36.2 tons/acre or 15.1 cords/acre.

Special Conditions:

1. **Seasonal Restriction:** No cutting, skidding, or road building from April 15th to July 15th due to the risk of oak wilt.
2. Cutting must be concurrent for all species, including 1-5" dbh trees where designated.
3. Do not cut, knock down or utilize any dead trees unless they pose a safety hazard to the operator.
4. No equipment allowed within 15' of a wetland area. All other BMP's for water quality shall be followed.
5. No tops or slash allowed across any red line or within a wetland. Slash within 50 feet of town and county roads must be lopped and scattered within 2 feet of the ground and pulled back into the sale area at least 10 feet from the road. Slash must be pulled back at least 10 feet from any snowmobile trail.
6. All woods roads and snowmobile trails must be repaired to pre-harvest condition upon sale completion or before removal of equipment from the sale area.
7. All pine products cut between April 1 and September 1 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to April 1 of each year.
8. If the contract is to be worked on during multiple time periods a mid-contract "pull-off" inspection meeting will be required. One-week notice shall be given by the contractor prior to moving equipment off-site. During the "pull-off" inspection provisions needing attention will be documented. The contractor at this time can decide to remedy them before pulling off or rectify them when moving back onto the site. If the latter is chosen documented items shall be addressed before harvesting can continue.
