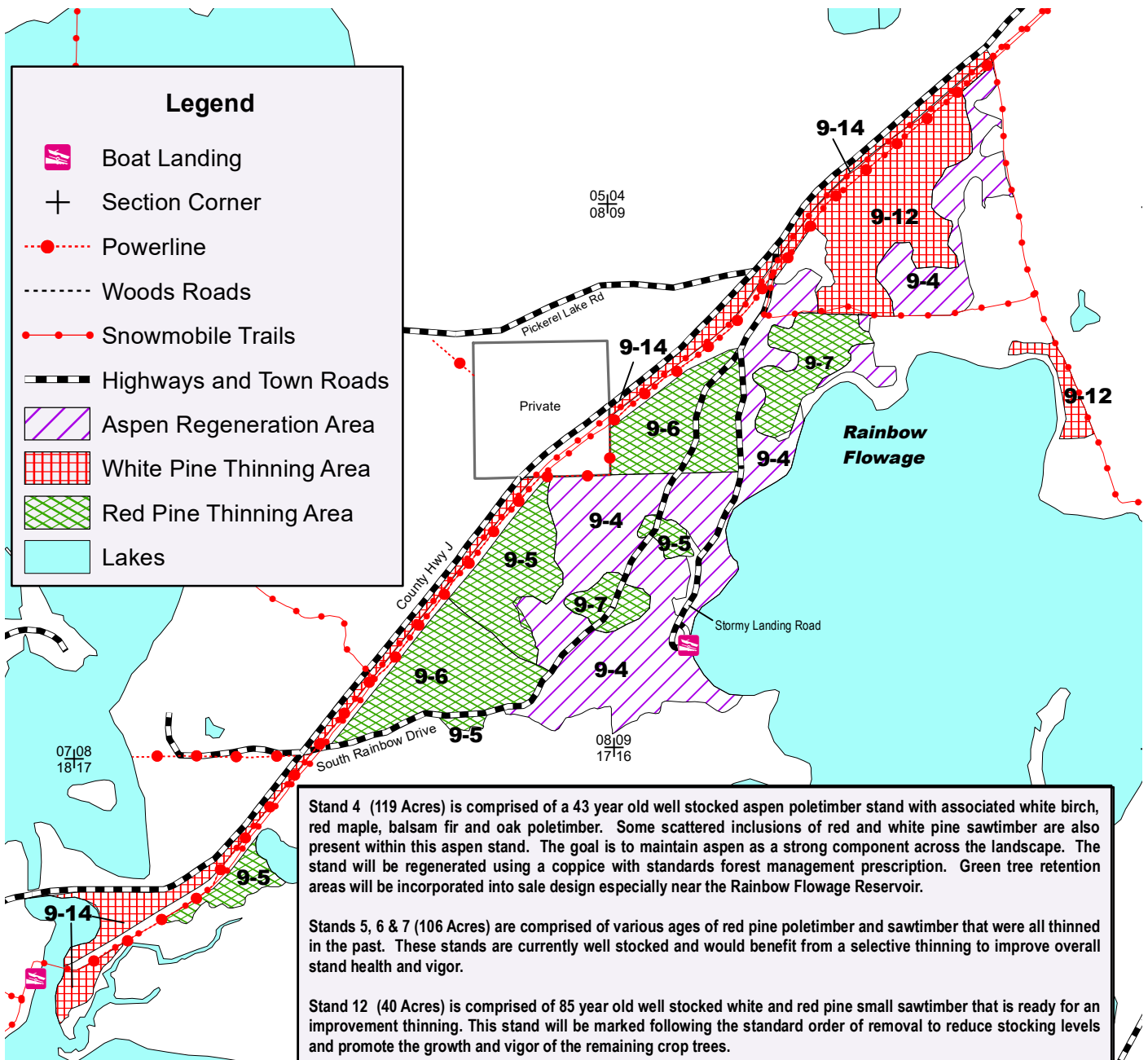


Northern Highland - American Legion State Forest
C9A Stands 4, 5, 6, 7, 12 & 14
Stormy Rainbow 300 Acres
Town of Newbold, Oneida County, T39N-R8E Secs. 4, 8, 9 & 17
NHAL - SF Master Plan: Mgmt. Area 6 - Oneida Sandy Plains - Forest Production



Stand 4 (119 Acres) is comprised of a 43 year old well stocked aspen poletimber stand with associated white birch, red maple, balsam fir and oak poletimber. Some scattered inclusions of red and white pine sawtimber are also present within this aspen stand. The goal is to maintain aspen as a strong component across the landscape. The stand will be regenerated using a coppice with standards forest management prescription. Green tree retention areas will be incorporated into sale design especially near the Rainbow Flowage Reservoir.

Stands 5, 6 & 7 (106 Acres) are comprised of various ages of red pine poletimber and sawtimber that were all thinned in the past. These stands are currently well stocked and would benefit from a selective thinning to improve overall stand health and vigor.

Stand 12 (40 Acres) is comprised of 85 year old well stocked white and red pine small sawtimber that is ready for an improvement thinning. This stand will be marked following the standard order of removal to reduce stocking levels and promote the growth and vigor of the remaining crop trees.

Stand 14 (35 Acres) is a 99 year old well stocked white pine sawtimber stand. This stand is an aesthetic strip between Hwy J and the adjacent powerline to the south. This strip is about 2 miles in length just south of CTH J. This stand was thinned in the past and portions of the stand are now ready for another improvement thinning. This stand will be marked following the standard order of removal to reduce stocking levels to promote the growth and vigor of the remaining crop trees. This thinning will also release advanced natural pine and aspen saplings in the understory.

There is a good network of woods roads, snowmobile trails and town roads. There is great access to County Hwy J. Biomass harvesting is not allowed due to restricted soils.
