10:15 All	COVID-19 Response	Chad – Brown County  Transfer facility is not taking any checks or cash. Credit card and account payments for everything (luckily had an update to system, kiosk and scales last year) Tonnages are significantly up from household clean up Office staff are working, some remotely and some essential trying to maintain distance Still running meetings for south landfill construction which started on 4/1 Amber – Clean Wisconsin Hearing of system closures in other states but noting in Wisconsin yet Tom – SCS Field staff still working and are following instructions from landfills as well as internal safety policies and have been able to work mostly operating without any direct contact with people on site Lynn – Waste Management All services continue uninterrupted except for bulk waste collection in most areas (unless municipal contracts require it). This choice was made to reserve capacity for essential SW and RCY collection. Closed public drop offs if the site could not meet social distancing or safety standards but day to day collection and LF operation continue. Preparing for contingencies and are most concerned about recycling because some markets slowing such as PET markets for carpet manufacturing. Have arranged some additional storage capacity. Made a number of operational changes at MRFs (one-way hallway directions), a training center as an additional lunchroom and one person per table. Concerns about potential employee shortages on the horizon that they are working to address. So far have not seen shortages due to employee personal illness. Employee attendance has actually improved. Do have sick leave in place to incentivize staying home if sick. Tim – Advanced Disposal Also seeing approved attendance and no shortages yet. Have implemented new cleaning procedures on equipment and yellow iron and distancing practices Seeing volume decreases with commercial waste streams. Residential MSW pickups are increasing. These collections are based on pick up frequency not volume, so this has some additional concerns. Alsot

		opportunities especially with green and healthy schools.  Midwest compost bin group purchase may have changed distribution site dates  AROW trying to adapt and just having to reschedule things like tours but not a whole lot of changes. Will have next meeting virtually.  Allen – Eagle Waste and Recycling  Not substantially impacted yet but have implemented similar safety measures to other members.  Split recycling operation into two separate crews running half speed in two shifts so if a health issue arises one crew would still be available to process material.  John – Dane County  Similar procedures to what has already been mentioned, only taking credit cards, doors to scale house are locked, no interaction between staff and public even for deliveries, no switching between machines, staff not within 10 feet of each other  Not sure if 10-foot separation will be able to be maintained into construction season and pipe placement  Closed haz waste collection facility but looking for options to open for some time sensitive drop offs  Compressed gas plant has limited operators so people entering that operating area are required to complete a health survey and temp monitoring before entering.  Asked how DNR will be doing any onsite construction inspections. Brad replied that the Department has established protocols on field work and that staff are supposed to be working from home. Construction inspections will primarily be done using photos and video. Construction season just starting so we have not had a construction inspection event yet and will be learning how to do that remotely. Brad predicted staff would call into preconstruction meetings and then make case by case recommendations on what they need to see by photo or video.  Meleesa Marathon County  Following similar procedures of distancing, not sharing equipment, disinfecting, cash is still coming in but they are rounding down to nearest dollar and is treated per Marathon County EHS staff recommendation.  Public is not doing a good job following social dista
